PRACTICAL INFORMATION

French courses	<p>The department of French as a Foreign Language (DEFLE Département d'Etude du Français Langue Étrangère) offers courses for non-native French speakers that can be part of the students study plan and do not have any additional cost. The courses available will depend on the field of study where the student has been nominated. Beside those courses, DEFLE organizes a Summer School. This is independent of the students mobility for studies within the framework of our partnerships and at the expense of the students, but may perhaps be of interest.</p>
Housing	<p>For <u>students with low income</u>, there is a number of spots reserved in some social residences from CROUS (mostly outside Campus). To apply the students will have access to an application form after they have been accepted. Note: the students cannot choose their residence, rooms are allocated according to availability, prioritizing students who come from outside Europe.</p> <p>For <u>students with medium income</u>, our partners Studapart offer a lot of different housing possibilities (apartment-sharing, private residences, private apartment, etc.). Their adverts are reserved for students of the university Toulouse Jean Jaurès, their platform is secure and they offer excellent customer service and support for students.</p> <p>For <u>student with medium/higher income</u>, the University of Toulouse propose paying packs and services adapted to students' needs: the Toul'box. In addition to personalized support in finding accommodation, the Toul'box team offers a range of basic services for the students to save precious time and start their stay in Toulouse with tranquility (personalized appointment, delivery of a transportation card, assistance in opening a bank account, etc.)</p> <p>Whatever the type of housing, students can apply to the CAF (Caisse d'Allocations Familiales) to ask for housing benefits that might be granted according to their economic situation.</p>
Health and Medical insurance	<p><u>European students</u> need to apply for a European Health Insurance Card from the relevant body in their country of origin.</p> <p><u>Non-European students</u> need to register at the "Sécurité Sociale" (free and online).</p> <p>There is a health service on campus, SIMPPS, which offers free consultations by appointment (general practitioners, social workers, nurses, psychologists)</p> <p>Students with special needs who benefit from special arrangements at their home university may benefit from the same arrangements at the Université Toulouse Jean Jaurès, if these arrangements also exist at our institution. To do so, they must present an official document from their home university.</p>
Visa and immigration	<p>It is the students' responsibility to get informed and apply for a visa at the French embassy/consulate of their home country. According to students' nationality, they might also need to register first to Etudes en France platform.</p>
Cost of living	<p>Average monthly budget for a student in Toulouse is around 1199€ (housing, transport, food, etc.).</p>
Student association	<p>On campus, the EIMA student association welcomes and helps international students to better integrate into university life.</p>
